



Services offered: Specialized assessment and counselling services for children and youth who have experienced the trauma of abuse, individual and group counselling, online psychoeducation workshops for parents and caregivers, expressive arts group, youth dating violence (YDV) intensive intervention program, and abuse prevention and intervention programming

Eligibility: Specific eligibility criteria varies by program; children, youth, and their families who have experienced sexual, physical, or emotional abuse, neglect, or who have witnessed domestic violence; children and youth up to 12 years old who are engaging in concerning sexual behaviour; youth between 12 and 18 years old (19 years old if involved in the justice system) who have offended sexually; youth between 12 and 24 years old who have chosen to use violence in a dating relationship

Referral: Process is done through the Intake Coordinator; youth, parents/caregivers, children's aid societies, and community partners can make referrals

Languages: Assessment and counselling services can be offered in French; translation services are available for those that require them


